5 Pre-race requirements (checklist)

a Anti-doping education program

All athletes, coaches, and support personnel must have completed the relevant anti-doping online course on the WADA Anti-Doping Education Learning platform (ADEL) corresponding to their role. The certificates showing completion should be sent by each National Federation to the PEU Slalom Chair Sára SEPRENYI SSEPRENYI@paddle-europe.eu. Previous certificates are still valid for this season. There is no need to repeat the program unless the person's role changes (e.g. athlete becoming coach).

Accreditations will not be issued until the certificates are marked off.

b Entry list checking

Once the team leader arrives on the competition site, they must go to the accreditation office to check:

- the entry list per nation and notify of any modifications to nominal entries
- the national anthem
- the national flag

c Official training sessions requests

If any NF had a specific request concerning the official training sessions for a competition, these should have been sent by email to the PEU Slalom Chair before the numerical entries' deadline. No requests will be considered after that deadline.

The PEU team will try to match these requests when building the official training schedule. Do not consider that a request sent will necessarily be done.

d Guidelines for advertising on equipment

i Generic guidelines

For canoe slalom boats, ICF Nation and athlete's name stickers are mandatory. Further information can be found in the [ICF guidelines for advertising trademark identification on equipment](#) document.

For Kayak Cross boats, only the Nation Sticker is required. It has to be placed in a suitable place in front of the cockpit. The actual location may vary depending on the model of the boat. The Nation sticker is the same dimensions as for the Canoe Slalom boats.

ii Specific guidelines for the 2026 PEU CSL Jun & U23 Championships.

There will be no sponsor stickers for this event. Only the mandatory ICF, Nation and athlete-name stickers described above apply.

ii Backup solution

In case of issues using the TVS cloud solution, a backup option will be made available at the enquiry desk. There, the Nation TVS managers under the supervision of the PEU TVS manager, will be able to plug their own device via a RJ45 wire and download the files needed. Keep in mind that this backup solution is limited. Access will be granted for a short period of time, and priority will be given to NF's having athletes competing in the next competition phase on that day.

b Venue layout

A venue map is attached in Appendix 1.

Every location referred to in this guide uses the numbering of that plan, in the form category.item (for example 4.1 = Equipment Control, 2.4 = Start Area). The full legend is reproduced in Appendix 1.

c Venue Access

Team parking is located outside the restricted area:

- Trailers: on the square in front of the GESN club. No time restrictions, no surveillance or fencing. Teams are encouraged to park their trailers on the grass area where possible, to keep the paved surface available for other vehicles.

- Vehicles: along Quai de Dogneville. No time restrictions, no surveillance. A rearview-mirror parking badge is required for reserved spots; badges will be provided at accreditation. **National Federations must submit their vehicle details (registration plate, vehicle type) in advance to matthieu.claudet@gmail.com (cc: m.biazizzo@gmail.com) in order to receive their badges.**

During competition hours, only organisation vehicles, officials, rescue services, deliveries and port maintenance vehicles may access the port parking inside the site.

d NF areas

The organisation will provide each team with a number of marquees proportional to team size. Each team's marquee is labelled directly on the tent. No additional tents or structures may be erected without prior authorisation from the HOC.

Teams may set up any furniture they wish inside their designated marquee and may use the immediate perimeter around it.

To help preserve the site and ensure a comfortable environment for all teams, we kindly ask everyone to:

- Avoid attaching or hanging any items to trees, as current weather conditions have made them particularly fragile.
- Refrain from hanging items on the Athlete Village boundary fences.
- Be considerate of neighbouring teams and check with them before setting up in front of their area.

The NF area comprises the Athlete Village (3.3), the Boat Racks (3.4), the Repair Workshop (3.5) and the Course Access (3.6). Nearby facilities include the Athletes' Lounge (3.1), Medical & Care (3.2), Restrooms (1.3), First Aid Station (9.1), Information Desk (7.1) and Food & Beverage Area (7.3).

Power distribution

Power connection points will be available in the NF area. Each team is responsible for bringing their own extension cords and power strips.

Please make sure that your electrical equipment is reliable and does not create any shortcuts or overload on the main network during the competition.

Wireless routers

Wireless routers must be outside the following frequencies:

- 5785 GHz, band width +/- 20 MHz
- 5825 GHz, band width +/- 20 MHz

At no time should any wireless router system be connected to the computer which is connected to the TVS LAN cable

Any team found to be using a device affecting the competition will have power removed to their compete system.

e Equipment control

Equipment Control (4.1) for canoe slalom and Kayak Cross Individual is located on river left, immediately after the finish line. The Kiss & Cry area (4.2) is at the top of the stairs leading out of the course, under the tent just above the Equipment Control exit.

Self-checking hours (at the finish area): self-checking equipment will be available from 15 minutes before the start of the first training or competition slot until 15 minutes after the end of the last slot of the day. Available from Monday 1st August onwards.

Equipment control will be open each competition day 1h before the 1st boat starts. In Canoe and Kayak event and in Kayak Cross Individual: there will be random post competition control checking.

In Kayak Cross Elimination races, equipment control is located next to the start ramp in the start ramp passage and will be pre-competition for all athletes.

f Doping control

Location: in the GESN canoe-kayak club building, close to the finish area. The changing rooms and toilets of the building will be used for doping control procedures.

Athletes will be notified for Doping Control in the finish area.

Passports or ID are required for Athletes selected for doping control.

g Enquiry/Protest desk

The Inquiries & Protests desk (4.3) will be located in the race management area, under a tent just below the footbridge at the bottom of the course.

h Medal ceremonies

Medal ceremonies will take place at the podium (7.6), in front of the stage, behind the grandstand (7.2).

Athletes involved in the Finals for Canoe Slalom events should bring their national uniform to the Protocol & Ceremonies area (5.2). There will be boxes there to place the uniform in. There is only a short time between the end of the competition and the medal ceremonies.

7 Competition Information

a Official Training Schedule

The training schedule is available on the Paddle Europe website and has been distributed via the official WhatsApp group.

As at every competition, athletes competing exclusively in Kayak Cross are not permitted to participate in the slalom training sessions. This also applies to canoe slalom athletes not competing in kayak cross, they are not permitted to participate in Kayak Cross training sessions.

b Competition Schedule

The course is closed following the end of official training (Tuesday 4th August – 13:30) until the end of the competition.

The competition schedule version 3 will be spread on WhatsApp before 10:00 on Tuesday 4th August.

e Course Approval

i Generic rules

Paddle Europe wants to remind you that the course designers are:

- Selected from a pool of skilled people proposed by the NF,
- ITOs, which means independent from any NF during the competition.

Any pressure or kind of harassment towards the course designers, as for any ITOs, may lead to sanctions.

ii 2026 PEU Junior & U23 Slalom European Championships course approval information

National Federations feedback about the course designs can be reported to Sára Seprenyi, the PEU Slalom Chair, to be integrated into the Course Approval process. Feedback will be accepted from only one representative per federation at the following times:

- Heats course & Teams course: on Tuesday 6 August 2026 from 14:40 to 14:50 at the top bridge, river left.
- Semi/Finals course: on Thursday 8 August 2026 from 18:30 to 18:40 at the top bridge, river left.

f Bib Distribution

Images of the bibs, and their number ranges are available in Appendix 3.

- Training bibs will be available from the Sports Information desk from 7:00 on Saturday 1st August. All training Bibs for a nation must be returned together after the last training session for the nation on Tuesday 4th August.
- CSL and Kayak Cross Individual competition bibs will be available at the Sports Information Desk on 4th August.
- Accreditation Fees must be fully paid to receive competition bibs.
- A 100 euros deposit (cash only) is required at the collection of the bibs and will be returned once all the competition bibs are returned. All Competition bibs need to be returned.
- The Kayak Cross Individual bibs will be collected right after each athlete's run in the finish line area.
- For Elimination phases the number and colour bibs will be distributed individually at the start area before the first heat. Then, the colour bibs will be collected at finish line area and reissued in the start area.
- The number bibs need to be brought back to the Sport information desk (all at once) after the competition (the deposit will be given back to you at this time).

g Opening Ceremony

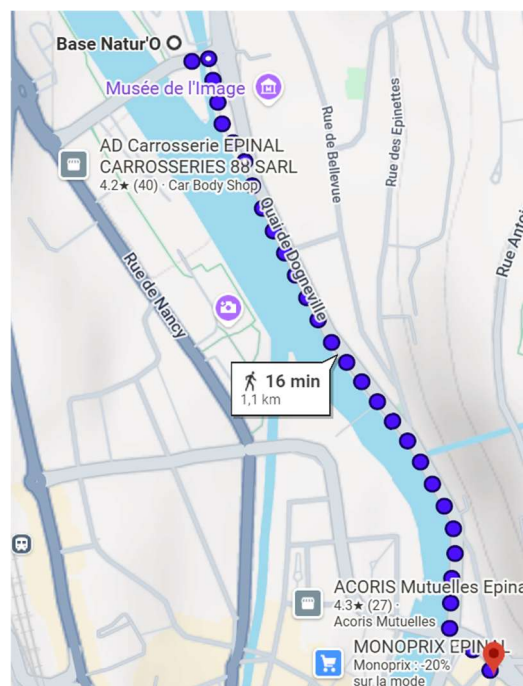
The opening ceremony will take place in downtown Épinal on the eve of the first competition day (Tuesday 4 August 2026). The goal is to introduce the sport and the athletes to the residents of the city and to young people in the leisure centres.

Meeting point: in the city centre, a 15 minute walk from the base.

Teams will gather near the roundabout at the north of Rue General Leclerc in the city centre to be ready at 18:30

The teams will then parade to Place des Vosges
The short ceremony will commence at 19:00, with speeches and the presence of local elected officials to follow.

Please note that on Tuesday 4 August, the course will be closed and water will be turned off at 18:00 so that everyone can attend the ceremony. The detailed ceremony programme and parade route map will be shared in due course.



8 Canoe and Kayak Events

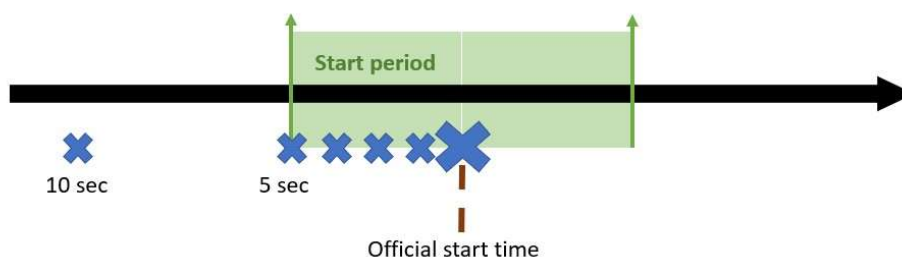
a Pre-start procedure

There will be a clock on river right showing race time and the next athlete to start.

b Start

i Generic rules

- At all times, the athletes must follow the Starter's instruction, or they may be disqualified for the run.
- At the start, there will be a countdown clock showing the time to start.
- There will be an acoustic signal (10 seconds before start, and then from 5 seconds before start - 4 shorts, 1 long - start).
- Athletes may start 5 seconds either side of their official start time which is signified by the long beep on the start clock.



ii Specific Rules

The starting boat must be in against the wall holding the start bar by the pumps.



The beam line is at the top of the channel.

Athletes may move to the start position once the previous athlete has broken the beam but must be at the start position 15 seconds before their start.

For the Teams Events the second and third Athlete should line up towards river right below the start position. Remember the first Athlete to break the beam should be in the Start blocks this can be "A", "B", or "C".

c Finish

i Generic rules

- During the finals, the leading, second and third athletes must proceed to the "Kiss and Cry" area (4.2) located immediately after Equipment Control (4.1), where the leader will be interviewed at the Interview Tent (6.2).
- Athletes must not leave the finish zone until dismissed by the Equipment Control Official once they are no longer needed for the ceremonies, anti-doping or equipment control.
- They then proceed via the mixed zone back to the Athlete area (3.3)
- Athletes should wear their competition bib in the mixed zone for identification purposes.

ii Specific rules

- The finish beam is marked by a suspended banner across the course.
- All athletes must exit via the stairs at the bottom of the course to pass through Equipment Control (4.1)

9 Kayak Cross events

a Pre-start procedure

i Generic rules

Athletes need to be at the pre-start area prior to their start to prepare their boats (and equipment control during the Elimination phase), and receive any final instructions (colour bibs distribution, choosing their start lane).

Volunteers will be there to help your athlete, if needed, on the ramp.

ii Specific rules

Athletes need to go through equipment control in the white tent shown next to the Kayak Cross Embarkation Area on the venue plan (Equipment Control, 4.1; Kayak Cross Embarkation Area, 2.6).

Access to the Kayak Cross start ramp: two options will be allowed. Option 1: athletes disembark from the Moselle, take the stairs and reach the foot of the ramp. Option 2: athletes go up the conveyor belt and exit midway to reach the ramp. Start procedure

iii Generic rules

- An automatic start machine will be used for all phases.
- At all times, the athletes must follow the starters instructions.
- The start time for Kayak Cross Individual will be triggered by photocell.
- At the start, a Pre-Start Official will inform your Athlete if they have progressed.
- As an automatic starting mechanism is to be used, the athlete must start with both hands on the paddle, positioned alongside the kayak. The front hand must be placed over the middle of the boat on one side, in contact with the boat or the spraydeck.



- The start orders will be the following ones:
 - 1)"In position" => the athletes must place their paddle in the start position
 - 2)"Ready" => the athletes wait in steady position; no movement is allowed following the "Ready" command.
 - 3)The platform will tilt to indicate the start. The starter will not say "Go".

iv Specific rules

I ➤ Kayak Cross Individual

- Athletes must start from lane 2 on the platform (second lane from river left).
- The start interval is **1 minute**; athletes should get in their boat directly on the platform.

II ➤ Elimination phases

- Athletes should be settled in the start position on the ramp 90 seconds before their start time.
- They should then listen to the sports presentation where they will be introduced to spectators.

b Finish

I Generic rules

- The finish time for Kayak Cross Individual will be triggered by photocell.
- During the Elimination phase a photo finish system will be deployed.

II Specific rules

- **There is a different finish line to the canoe & kayak events – see the map.**
- All athletes must exit via the stairs at the bottom of the course to pass through kiss and cry (4.2) and mixed zone.

c Rules reminder

I Kayak Roll

For the roll barrier, the roll must be performed by going down on one side and coming up on the other. During the execution of the roll, the boat must be underneath the barrier for at least one phase of the action.

II Dangerous Contact

In the case of dangerous contact, the judges will decide the penalty and one or both boats may be penalised.

10 Other Topics

a Injury & illness report

The ICF Medical Committee has developed a new reporting tool (Microsoft Forms) through which your athletes, team leaders, and team staff can report any injury or illness occurring during an ICF or PEU competition. This tool is available across all ICF disciplines and is fully anonymous and confidential.

The purpose of this initiative is to collect data that will enable the ICF Medical Committee and the ICF Discipline Committees to assess potential risks and implement the necessary measures to ensure athlete safety.

b Prevention of Harassment and Abuse in Sport (PHAS)

Training Bibs

A single sequence is being used for training bibs:

- Group B Bibs 30-55
- Group C Bibs 60-86
- Group D Bibs 90-115
- Group E Bibs 120-145
- Group F Bibs 150-176
- Group G Bibs 180-206
- Group H Bibs 210-236
- Group I Bibs 240-267
- Group J Bibs 270-297
- Group K Bibs 300 to 327

Kayak Cross training will use the same bibs as slalom training.

Where athletes are only entered for Kayak Cross, additional bibs will be issued. Teams are reminded that those entered for Kayak Cross only cannot paddle in the slalom sessions, and those entered for slalom only are not permitted to paddle in Kayak Cross slots.

Forerunners

Forerunners will use the training bibs. Refer to the Demonstrator & Forerunners list (appendix 2).

Kayak Cross Elimination
